



Destination: Outside My Comfort Zone

A Q&A with Michelle Teague - an occupational therapist, wife, mom, Carmel member, and a reluctant trip goer.

Here is her story:

Why were you reluctant to go on a mission trip? I had never been on a mission trip before, I didn't even have a passport! I used the excuses of *money*, *time* and not being able to get off from **work**, and honestly there was *fear* of just going.

What was different about this year to make you go? I had been asked for 3 years to go on a trip to Albania. This year the trip leader contacted me and said we really need YOU... Me, an occupational therapist. I had felt a tugging to go for years, this was just me finally obeying God.



How did you overcome the issue of money for the trip? My trip leader encouraged me to fundraise. At first, I was embarrassed by that - I don't know why. But I put it out there and *it's incredible to see how many people want to be a part of your trip!* It also provides an opportunity to talk about Jesus to your friends, Christian or not, when they ask why you are going. *God provides.*

What would you say to anyone who feels a tugging but has fear to go? I didn't feel qualified, but *God will equip you with all you need* - He did that and more for me. Don't let money stand in your way, *God will provide*. I encourage you just to be obedient and go - *you will not be the same*. We are blessed when we obey.

Are you practicing generosity? Do you believe you can grow in the area of generous living?


