We seek community transformation through the powerful work of Jesus and we are committed to serving families in greatest need in our city and around the world in ways that that are practical, sustainable and burden lifting. We believe that the only way a community is transformed is by putting Jesus at the center and allowing his work to bring change. Our goal is to bring hope back to these communities that feel lost, forgotten, and in despair. The goal of Project 658 is to see hope restored.

So What will Carmel Students be Doing?

Carmel is committed to making disciples of those Nearest, our Neighbors and the Nations.At Carmel we have defined a disciple as a follower of Christ in learning and living.This trip will be committed to just that: learning and living. Students will *learn* more about who God is, who they are, and the call to missions as they *live* out their faith in a practical way.

Students will work with Project 658 to share Christ through VBS at their facility and develop intentional relationships in a couple key apartment complexes.

Students will be asked to lead various stations throughout the day, such as crafts, sports, music, games, Bible story, etc. Students will be equipped to give their testimony and express the hope that Jesus alone provides.

A key investment will be to develop partnership with families in the community to Project 658 to provide mentoring and friendship. Students will also participate in some of the relief portions of ministry at Project 658.
