 everything.


Stories matter. They inspire, challenge, encourage and inform us. We each have one that is God-given and unique. And we want to get better about sharing these stories!

CAMP CARMEL

STUDENT MISSIONS

SUMMER HIGHLIGHTS

On the other side of the equator within our very own time zone Carmel missionaries Craig and Daisy Tippie are ministering in Huacho, Peru. Despite Huacho being known as the witchcraft capital of Peru, there is a great light shining into the darkness and a vision to reach, teach and disciple in the name of Jesus.

Carmel Students partnered this past summer with the Tippies to provide a mission-critical need – hosting a youth conference. With financial support through Carmel's Lois Bumpus Scholarship, 15-year-old Brooke Bulter, was among the 32 students who spent 8 days at Iglesia Cristiana assisting with a youth conference and participating in outreach efforts.

If you don't know me, I am a listener and not really a talker, which means I don't like to speak in front of crowds or strangers. In Huacho, it was necessary to do both.

The main purpose of our trip was working with the church Iglesia Cristiana Huacho, leading a youth purity conference. The conference lasted for the whole week and took place every night. Our student team was divided into 8 groups, and each team was given a lesson on purity to teach. My group was given the task of teaching the distortions from God's design, including adultery, unwanted sexual contact, modesty, cohabitation, depression, and suicide.

This was a very heavy topic to teach about, but it helped me grow as a person and a Christian. I learned how to be bold and confident, which did not come from me, but solely from the Holy Spirit. This past spring, I did a Bible study on Acts, and I admired the boldness Paul and other disciples had in sharing the gospel.

"One thing that really amazed me about the church was their worship."

They were always singing praise songs or playing guitar; it was constant. When we would have scheduled worship, they would get up on stage and just give it all to God, not worrying about making it a concert. It was so AWEsome to sing and learn new songs in Spanish, and I didn't have to worry about being in key, but just giving it all to God.













DID YOU KNOW? 37 students received a Lois Bumpus scholarship this past year. Because of Lois' deep love for Christian missions and her passion to see young men and women serving as missionaries, the Lois Bumpus Missions Endowment and Scholarship Fund were created to honor her lifetime commitment to sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The purpose of these funds is to underwrite missionary work across the globe for 16 to 26 year old members of Carmel. It is the desire of the Bumpus family that these dollars be used to help young men and women spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ across the globe through short-term mission trips.

CREATING A LEGACY

CARMEL CHRISTIAN SCHOOL MINISTRY CELEBRATES 25 YEARS

"On February 9, 1993, it was recommended that Carmel expand our school program to include Kindergarten. The recommendation was unanimously agreed upon, God Himself orchestrated the whole event and the ministry of Carmel Christian School was born," said Debbie Vanhoy, founding head of school.

Carmel Christian School (CCS) opened in the Fall of 1993 with 44 students in 2 Kindergarten classes and 5 faculty/staff members at our original Carmel Road location. The school's stated purpose was to "work together in a ministry effort to see that the influences of home, school and church compliment one another." For the last twenty-five years, CCS has stayed true to this purpose while discipling students to impact the world for Christ.


"A teacher's dream and a church's vision was now a reality."

In 1997, Carmel relocated to Matthews and held their first worship service on June 8. That August, the school ministry opened its doors having grown to a K-4 school. The foundation of academics and discipleship were expanded to include athletic and fine arts as the ministry grew. The first athletic teams (Middle School Golf and Cross Country) were added in 2000. What we now call the Auxillary Gym was completed in 2001, increasing the sports offerings to include basketball and volleyball. The first school play, "The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe," was performed by the Middle School CCS Players in 2001.

Since 1993, the Lord has expanded the ministry of Carmel Christian School as relationships have been built with families in the local and church communities. The school has continued to grow to over 900 students in Grades K-12, including the expansion of high school enrollment from 7 to 338 students, since its addition in 2010.

CCS cultivates a community of academic excellence, artistic expression and athletic distinction marked by intentional discipleship. CCS students, faculty and staff are creating a legacy of prayer and relationships built upon a biblical foundation for future generations. We can't wait to see how He will work through CCS over the next 25 years as we remain committed to making disciples of those nearest, our neighbors and the nations.

2015 OAKHURST REPLANT THRIVING

The Biblical Reporter recently spotlighted Oakhurst Baptist - a church revitalization project of which Carmel has been privileged to be a part. We're so grateful to see what God has done here!



Four years ago, Oakhurst Baptist Church was prepared to close its doors. Located just a few miles southeast of Charlotte's city center, the once-thriving congregation had weathered a changing demographic and economic climate but retained only a few dozen members. However, today it is showing signs of new growth, the fruits of an effort rooted in local church partnerships and denominational cooperation.

Oakhurst Pastor, David Russell, shares Carmel's passion for church revitalization and was inspired to lead the "replant" because of the long-term revitalization he witnessed at Capitol Hill Baptist in the 1990s.

According the Metrolina Baptist Association, a significant number of area churches are in "serious decline," meaning worship attendance has decreased more than 50 percent in the last 10 years.

"It gave me a picture of the power behind helping revive an old, historic gospel witness." David said.

"We don't want to see churches become coffee shops and condos in neighborhoods that are now booming with population growth."


Along with mentorship, Carmel provided financial support and "sweat equity" for the replant, with teams assisting the needed building repairs and upgrades to Oakhurst's facility. Members of Carmel even left to join the replant team.

ASKING ABOUT DREAMS

It was through an invitation from his Discipleship Community that Don ended up serving breakfast to men in the Rebound program at Charlotte Rescue Mission monthly. CRM is a Carmel ministry partner that helps transform lives by serving people impacted by addiction.

One morning after Pastor Alex finished the ABLE series, Don was motivated to step out from behind the serving line and join a table of men. The men varied in age and tenure at CRM but each extended a welcome. After short introductions, Don asked the men "tell me a little bit about your dreams when you complete the program at CRM."

Jason was sitting at this table. He was outgoing and as he spoke of his faith walk and experiences in the business world, Don was struck by how much their stories paralleled. He was also struck by Jason's genuine desire for a new beginning.

Don's question opened the door for continued conversations with Jason on those breakfast mornings. And they stayed connected even after Jason graduated from the Rebound program. The two gathered together to study the Word. And at Jason's recent baptism at New Charlotte Church, Don was present to celebrate!

"God wants to use all of us as His hands and feet to bring the Good News of hope. No one is beyond His reach."

If you've never tried serving at Rebound or are nervous about stepping outside your comfort zone, Don says this:

"Just go! Pray for God's direction. Find a way to connect with the people you are serving. Tell them a little bit about yourself, your journey of faith, and why you came. Be a friend. Ask them about their dreams. God will do the rest!"

I'm Not the Hero of My Story Jason Kipp, Rebound Resident - Charlotte Rescue Mission

Growing up in Proctorville, OH, Jason was successful - at thirteen he started his own mowing enterprise, he played four sports, and was popular at school. He was a devoted Christian and was baptized in 4th grade. However, his spiritual walk eventually grew stale. He tried his first beer at thirteen and marijuana at fourteen, and both habits became a way of life in high school.

In 1996 Jason moved to Charlotte, which was initially a wonderful place professionally, but as the economy struggled, Jason was laid off multiple times, and he began to rely on the numbing effects of drugs and alcohol. After being arrested for a DWI in June of 2017 and consequently resigning from his job, Jason soon found himself drinking a case of beer or more a day and lacking money

In February, within an hour of being evicted, Jason took a knife to his wrist. He was determined to end his pain and shame, but God was not going to give up on him. As his life was leaving his body, an acquaintance "just happened" to come see how he was doing.

Jason recovered and arrived at Rebound on February 20, where God began working. On February 23, he attended his first AA meeting, where thirty seconds into telling his story he revealed himself as a broken man whom God was starting to heal.

Today, Jason is a month away from graduation, and the three greatest observations he shared back in March when he was just thirty days into the program are the same today:

- I am not in control. Jason is continuing to learn and embrace that God is in control of his life,
- I can complete this program, if I put in the work. Jason, through God's grace, sees CRM's program as tough but very doable if a person wants it enough.
- There are so many people that want to help and have a vested interest in my success. Jason is greatly encouraged by the countless volunteers who serve, the staff who invest their careers, and CRM's ministry partners who invest their hearts and resources into helping him

When asked to summarize everything he's learned these past three months, Jason responded, "I'm not the hero of my story." Jason continues to be a Type A kind of guy, but he's learning to entrust himself and his recovery to God. As he lets go of his need to control his own life, he gains freedom from addiction and a greater chance of life-long recovery.

TRANSFORMATION

THROUGH HEALING & THE WORD



Mary and John were high school sweethearts and have been married for 18 years. Mary discovered the depth of John's pornography addiction the night of their honeymoon - an addiction that had been growing since his first exposure at age 8.

After struggling through 7 years of marriage, John began to participate in a recovery group very similar to our **More Than Conquerors** - a curriculum and small group for men seeking to overcome pornography addiction. John had struggled and attempted to have victory over this addition for decades and sought

help from several sources; brothers in Christ, pastors, books, articles, and technology all with very little success. John's L.I.F.E. recovery group was life-changing and equipped John to recognize his addiction, identify and diffuse destructive patterns. **More Than Conquerors** is a similar safe place to build real relationships with people that understand the all-too-real struggle and have solid life changing advice.

In 2017 John and Mary learned about the **More Than Conquerors** and **Women Living Well** classes that were being offered at Carmel. While John had made great progress dealing with his addiction over the years Mary was still privately hurting on the inside. Women Living Well was just the tool she needed to begin her healing process. Women Living Well is a NEW confidential small group using curriculum for women who love men who battle pornography and sexual addiction. John encouraged Mary to participate.

Here Mary reflects on her experience:

"God had great surprises for me! First, I found that I am not alone! All of us were in different stages of the struggle, but able to relate to and encourage one another. Second, I was safe! My story, my very real feelings, and my very real battles we're safe. And finally, it was apparent that not all was lost, God can still be brought glory through our lives! Though God had been faithful to teach me much in my isolation, I still had much to learn about myself, my feelings, and my styles of communication. I have come away equipped and empowered to move forward as an individual, a wife, and a mother. This experience has been an important tool of God's redemption and favor in my life!"

"I encourage anyone who wants to see God work and to experience His love and grace at a very rich and deep level to take a leap of faith and join this next session! God is a Redeemer and Healer!"


Intercessory Prayer
